WSC provides important information, technical assistance, training and educational activities to ensure safe drinking water for the 43 million-plus Americans who rely on private wells and the millions more who are served by small, shared wells.

The **Water System Council's wellcare® program** is a dedicated program protecting the water supply and groundwater resources for more than 15 million U.S. households dependent on private water wells for their drinking water.

The Water Systems Council's wellcare® program helps well owners maintain their wells and ensures the quality of the water supply. We do this by providing consumers with education and information services, stressing the importance of proper testing and maintenance, and providing decision makers with useful information about wells.



Individual, domestic wells are cost-effective, dependable safe drinking water systems for more than **1 million people**, or at least **289,880 households in Connecticut** (41% of total groundwater use in the state).
