The Water System Council's wellcare® program is a dedicated program protecting the water supply and groundwater resources for more than 15 million U.S. households dependent on private water wells for their drinking water.

Individual, domestic wells are cost-effective, dependable safe drinking water systems for approximately **860,409 people,** or at least **245,832 households in Maine** (34% of total groundwater use in the state).

The Water Well Trust (WWT) is a 501(c)3 organization created by the Water Systems Council to provide a clean water supply to American families living without access to a precious resource most of us take for granted.

The WWT finances the construction of water wells for primarily rural, low-income families nationwide that need safe drinking water in areas where the extension of public water supplies to serve them does not make economic sense -- for them, for the public water supply owners, for federal, state or local funding sources.
